

Jobseekers can access and save three online assessments from www.illinoisworknet.com

To access the assessments, follow the following steps.

- 1) On the homepage for IllinoisworkNet, click on <Individuals Enter Here>
- 2) You **MUST** be signed up for an IllinoisworkNet account in order to access the assessments. If you have not yet set up an account, click on <Setup a My IllinoisworkNet account>. Fill out the appropriate information to create an account. Write down your user name and password so that you can access your account in the future!!!!
- 3) If you are already registered for an IllinoisworkNet account, click on the <Log in> box. Type in your user name and password.

- 4) After you have logged in, click on <My Skills and Interests>. Three assessment titles will appear in the middle of the screen: SKILLS Assessment, Interest Profiler, and Work Importance Locator. Select the assessment that you wish to take.

WHICH ASSESSMENT SHOULD I CHOOSE?

- **The SKILLS Assessment** helps you identify your present job skills, identify occupations that match those skills, understand what skills are required for a given occupation, and determine what training and skills you need for a particular job.
- **The Interest Profiler** asks you to evaluate 180 activities to determine your strongest work-related interests and match you with appropriate occupations.
- **The Work Importance Locator** asks you to prioritize your work values and matches you with appropriate occupations.
- **The Career Cluster Inventory** is geared toward someone with little work experience.

Using Your Work Values to Explore Occupations

You can use your work values to explore careers. Work values are good to use because you probably will find that occupations that meet your work values will be more satisfying and rewarding for you than occupations that don't meet your work values.

Remember, though, that work values are just some of the information that you can use to explore careers. Other useful information about yourself:

- your abilities,
- your interests,
- experience,
- education, and
- motivation

The links for each Work Value will display a list of occupations that match that value. You can then use the occupation links to learn more about the occupation.

Independence and Relationships

Follow the link above to display a list of occupations for which both of your top two values are important.

Independence Your Score: 24
People for whom independence is important like to make decisions and try out ideas on their own. They prefer jobs where they can plan their work with little supervision.

Relationships Your Score: 20
People for whom relationships are important like to work in a friendly, non-competitive environment. They like to do things for other people. They prefer jobs where they are not pressured to do things that go against their sense of right and wrong.

The remaining four work values are listed below. Even though they aren't your highest work values, you may want to explore their occupation lists. For work values that are somewhat important to you, you can find out which occupations still might suit you. For work values that are not important to you, you can find out which occupations you might be less suited for.

Achievement Your Score: 18
People for whom achievement is important like to see the results of their work and to use their strongest abilities. They like to get a feeling of accomplishment from their work.
